

REGAL HORNED LIZARD

FENNEC FOX

GREY WOLF

GROUNDHOG

GILA MONSTER

HEDGEHOG

PIG

HARP SEAL

SPIDER MONKEY

Habitat: Spider Monkeys live in the forest. They also live in the wild. They have no owner. They go places to get food to eat so they don't die. They need to live, if they are girls their babies will die.

Diet: They eat animals like fish. They also eat omnivore diets. They can always eat things they find in the forest. Because that is where they live.

KING COBRA

Description: A King Cobra is very powerful, once it sees the rat it strikes at the rat. King Cobras are venomous, it can grow up to eighteen feet long. The snake tries to act tough by expanding its ribs to make a hood making it look bigger.

Habitat: The Cobra lives in Southeast Asia, in rainforests.

Diet: Cobras eat rats and reptiles, along with little mammals and eggs. It's even possible that the Cobra eats other snakes and birds.

BLACK WIDOW SPIDER

Description: A female Black Widow has a red hour glass on it's bottom and is shiny black. A female and male Black Widow only see each other when they breed.

Habitat: They live on a web on a tree or on a branch or they might be living on the side of your house.

Diet: Black Widows are shorter than a tea spoon, they are more narrow than a penny. Black Widows are poisonous. A female Black Widow eats the male too.

RETICULATED GLASS FROG

Description: It is a small frog the length of a quarter. It leaps from one plant leaf to another, flaunting its little belly as it soars. The skin on the frog's underside is see-through.

Habitat: Reticulated Glass Frogs can be found in the rain forests of Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia, and Ecuador. These animals, which are active at night, inhabit vegetation along streams. Males can get pretty territorial, making squeaking noises to warn trespassing frogs to stay away from their leafy hangout spots. If an intruder doesn't leave, the frog will wrestle it to show it who is boss.

Diet: These frogs are carnivores, which means they are meat eaters.

CHEETAH

Description: The fastest mammal on land, the Cheetah can reach speeds of sixty or perhaps seventy miles per hour or over 113 kilometers an hour over distances. It usually chases its prey.

Habitat: Cheetahs live and hunt mainly in open grassland and bushy areas in parts of Africa and the Middle East.

Diet: Cheetahs eat small-size animals such as Mares, Impalas, Wildebeest, and Gazelles.

PRAIRIE DOG

Description: Prairie Dogs bark like dogs that how they got their name. The Prairie Dog is related to the squirrel. To greet another Prairie Dog they rub their noses together.

Habitat: In a hole, in North American, called Dog Lands, under the grasslands lives the Prairie Dog. Their predators are coyotes and snakes.

Diet: They have a herbivore diet.

SNOWY OWL

Description: When you see a Snowy Owl its clear how the bird is probably got it's name. They're snow-white! Males are generally whiter than females.

Habitat: These large owls mainly live in the open treeless areas called tundras. Snowy owls perch on the ground or a short post.

Diet: Snowy Owls have great eye sight, but can't see it's prey when it's underneath snow or thick layers of plants.
