How Many College Applications?

- Apply to a range of colleges
- Approximately 5 to 8:
 - 1-2 "safety" colleges
 - 2-4 overall "good matches"
 - 1-2 "reach" colleges

Common application (+1000)

Self-reporting school (Rutgers)

Visiting Prospective Colleges

There is NO SUBSTITUTE for the college visit!!!

- STATE COLLEGES (our state) TCNJ, Rutgers, Stockton, Montclair, William Patterson, etc.
- STATE COLLEGES (not in our state) Penn State, Pitt, University of Delaware
- PRIVATE COLLEGES (in or out of our state) Monmouth, Duquesne, Drexel

The College Application Process

 Be aware of deadlines- Don't wait until the last minute

Early Decision vs. Early Admission/Action,
 Rolling Admission, Regular Admission

Recommendation Letters


- Required by many colleges and scholarship applications
- Request in person and then send an electronic request through Major Clarity
- ASK EARLY, and give plenty of time to meet deadlines
- Write a thank you note

Types of Financial Aid

- Grants- Money you do not have to pay back- based on the FAFSA
- Loans- Money you need to pay back
- Scholarships- Merit from colleges and local scholarships
- Work Study- Part-time jobs on the college campus

Distributors of Financial Aid

- Federal Government (FAFSA)
- State Government (HESAA)/NJ STARS)
- Institution
- Community/Business
 Organizations- local scholarships

FAFSA

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- Most important financial aid document
- All financial aid from the federal government, state government, and institution derives from this form.
- Traditional paper copy or online version
- www.fafsa.gov
- Key word is FREE. Beware of scams
- File after October 1st

CSS Profile Form

- Financial profile form that many private colleges require in addition to the FAFSA
- Fee associated with this application.
- Form should be completed online at www.collegeboard.org
- Check to see if your school requires the form.

NJ STARS

- Top 15% of the class
- Covers tuition at any county college full time for up to 5 semesters
- Tuition is paid, but fees are not covered.

CAP COURSES

- Dual-enrollment
- List of courses approved by RCBC is in the Program of Studies on the PTHS website.
- Registration is on line
- Student's responsibility to get registered before deadline

AP Courses

. AP EXAM IN MAY

SCORE 1-5

MUST SEND SCORES DIRECTLY FROM COLLEGE BOARD TO COLLEGE.

Local Scholarships

- Local donors from throughout the Pemberton Township community.
- Complete list of all scholarships that come through the counseling department from the community.
- Some require additional essays.
- The information will be used by the scholarship committee/donors to establish award winners
- The more thorough the search, the better the chance for success.

General Timeline

- Develop a list of potential schools
- Begin to visit/investigate the schools on your list
- Check on admissions criteria
- Develop a plan/schedule for SAT/SAT Subject/ACT
- Work to achieve the highest possible grades for the year
- Meet with your counselor to review post-secondary options and senior year schedule

Timeline

Summer

- Continue to revise list of college choices
- Take any SAT prep courses (if needed)
- Test offered in August

Fall

- Retake SAT/ACT if needed. Tests offered in Oct., Nov., and Dec.
- Complete college applications
- File CSS profile if necessary
- ADD TO NAVIANCE
- Be aware of deadlines
