

Pemberton Township Schools to Open New Elementary School this September!



Pemberton Township Schools is proud to announce that this coming September, the new Denbo-Crichton Elementary School will open its doors to students in kindergarten through 5th grade. The new school, located in Browns Mills, is a state-of-the-art 126,000 square-foot building with the capacity to accommodate over 900 elementary students.

The beautiful new school has 39 classrooms and features a multi-purpose room with a stage, a gymnasium, science demonstration room, art room, cafeteria, tech lab, vocal music room, band room, media center and more!

Funded completely by the New Jersey Schools Development Authority (SDA) the \$62 million two-story elementary school is located on the previous Denbo/Crichton Elementary Campus at 1412 Junction Road in Browns Mills. It takes the place of two aging elementary schools, Aletta Crichton and Alexander Denbo Schools.

The school will open to students this coming September, and gives the district the opportunity to realign four elementary schools in order to use the new building to its greatest advantage.
