Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Burlington County Department of Health has informed us that the county COVID-19 activity level is now considered to be *High* in Burlington County. While COVID activity has not yet reached the *Very High* category, we have decided to take the precautionary measure to return students to an **All Remote Learning Program beginning Wednesday, November 25, 2020, through January 19, 2021.**

Beginning Wednesday, all Hybrid students currently attending in-person will transition back to the Remote program. Those students currently in Remote will not experience any changes. Students in highly specialized programs, however, will continue to attend in person 5 days a week. More information to the guardians of these specific students will be forthcoming in the next few days. In addition, our staff will continue to work from their school building, in order to provide the best educational experience possible.

If your child has been attending the Hybrid program, please make sure they take all personal belongings and medication home with them next Monday or Tuesday. Students in K-5 are asked to bring back their tote bags, in the event we need to send additional materials home. Please direct any questions to your building principal.

As the pandemic continues to present us with rapidly changing situations, we must all try to meet the challenges together. Our Pemberton family is a strong, supportive community and we will continue to strive to provide the best education in the circumstances presented to us.
