

Representatives from the following agencies were in attendance: Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services (DVRS), Resources for Independent Living (RIL), Occupational Training Center (OTC), Rowan College of Burlington County (RCBC), and Burlington County Institute of Technology, Adult Education. The agencies shared information about job placement, job coaching, tuition assistance, and self-advocacy. This opportunity provided parents and students with resources and information to prepare them for a successful transition after high school.
