Safety Patrol

Our 5th grade Safety Patrol is trained and now manning their posts and are eager to assist their fellow students and guest to the building. If you see them out and about be sure to stop and say hi. You will see them in the halls, out on the bus platform and at the crosswalks in the mornings and afternoons.

Just a few reminders:

- Student arrival starts at 9:00 am. Please DO NOT arrive and park in the drop off line prior to 8:50 am. Arriving any earlier disrupts the flow of traffic and staff trying to get to the staff parking lot. Dismissal begins at 3:45 pm. If you are doing everyday pickup, please try not to arrive more than 5 minutes prior to dismissal and do not line up in front of the school until the bell rings as that is a fire lane and needs to remain open as long as possible
- Please have and show a valid form of ID **EVERY** time you pick up your child from the building.
- If you have someone pick up your child other than you (the parent/guardian) they **MUST** be on your emergency list. Exceptions will only be made on a case by case basis and with a note signed by the parent/guardian sent in advance or an email to either the security office (sbaker@pemb.org) or main office (smcguinness@pemb.org) from the parents **Genesis registered** email address.
