#### Five Schools Named NJ State Schools of Character

Five more Pemberton Township Schools have been designated State Schools of Character this year, joining the district's four schools that earned the designation last year. Congratulations to **Fort Dix Elementary**, **Harker-Wylie**, **Stackhouse**, **Busansky and PECEC** on this distinguished honor!

"We are extremely proud that our schools continue to excel in building character," said superintendent Tony Trongone. Last year, four Pemberton schools earned the School of Character designation: Denbo, Helen Fort, Newcomb and Emmons. This year, Pemberton's five schools were the only schools in Burlington County to receive the designation. "What it comes down to is quite simple," said Trongone. "We want to send students out into the world who are both smart and good."

## Demolition of Crichton Makes Way For New Elementary School



### Summer Book Give-Away Comes Early to Harker-Wylie This Year



Phase I of the Crichton/Denbo project is moving forward, as crews recently completed the outdoor demolition of the Crichton building. Members of the SDA, Pemberton BOE and administration gathered to witness the start of the demolition on the project that will bring a new, modern 2-story elementary school to Pemberton. The new school, funded completely by the School Development Authority, will replace both Crichton and Denbo elementary schools with a prekindergarten through 5th grade facility that will house approximately 900 students.

## PTHS Student Athletes Execute Record-Breaking Performances

- In the fall, the PTHS Girls Soccer Team won the Patriot Division for the second consecutive year--the first time Girls Soccer has won back-toback championships in school history!
- The Girls Bowling Team was named the Liberty Division Girls Bowling Champions for the second consecutive year, and they finished the season with a new school record of 17-0-1.
- In wrestling, senior Alex Cawley finished the season with a 38-7 record, breaking the PTHS record for both single season wins, as well as single season pins, and giving him a total of 104 career wins. In addition, junior Joe Wilson finished the season with an impressive 37-6 record,

taking second in the districts and 3rd in the region—he is one of only 4 wrestlers who have qualified for states in the last decade.

 In Girls Basketball, senior Shavonne Smith scored 1,000 points, becoming only the 5th girl in PTHS history to reach this milestone! Shavonne will be attending Towson University on a full athletic scholarship next year.
